



Meridien Marinas

The Whitsundays region boasts a range of excellent marina facilities, including Meridien's Abel Point, offering first class facilities to a wide range of commercial and private clients.



During 2008, Abel Point accommodated over 40 superyachts, with one 45m vessel spending over four months at the marina. The marina caters to superyachts up to 55m in length, and hosts 500 berths ranging from 11m to 60m, with 110 of these berths suitable for vessels over 24m.

All berths are equipped with water and electricity. The marina also boasts dedicated refuelling berths, sewage pump out stations, waste oil disposal tanks, marine gas swap and refills, as well as excellent security.

The marina precinct accommodates over 30 tenants including bareboat charters, boat brokerages, marine electrical, mechanical, engineering and refrigeration services, a boatyard, cafés, restaurants and a bottle shop.

In addition, Queensland Parks and Wildlife, Queensland Primary Industries and Fisheries and the Queensland Water Police are centrally located on site and Bowen Customs is close to the precinct.

The marina is a convenient 10-minute walk from the heart of Airlie Beach and a five-minute drive to Airlie Beach's two major shopping centres. Access to Airlie Beach is simple with airports nearby at Proserpine, Hamilton Island and Whitsunday.

Airlie Beach hosts many restaurants and accommodation and with its central tropical lagoon is a great place to holiday or stopover point to the 74 beautiful islands of the Whitsundays.

Meridien also operate marinas in other uniquely desirable locations such as Port Douglas, Horizon Shores and the Port of Airlie development that is due for completion in 2010.
